Tried to work Martin at DL1GBZ on Sunday (28th) on 18.090 MHz but he could not copy my QRP signal. He was 549 here and he did copy my QRO signal - 90 Watts with the Ten-TecOMNI 6. Then on Wednesday (31st) he gave me 229 for my QRO - 90 Watt signal, so I didn't even try QRP. I had worked him at his home, IK2RMZ, on the 19th while running the K2 at 5 Watts - QRP. Was really surprised on the 26th to work ON4IQ on 24.903 MHz for only my second WARC band contact this year on 12 Meters. The other one was with Riley, K4ORD who lives about 10 miles away - Hi ! Was pleased to work Cam, HP1AC on the 29th using my KX1 - 4 Watts on 10.118 MHz for a new multiplier. And then another surprise to work OX3XR in Nuuk, Greenland. Can't remember the last time I worked an OX. Even had a QSO with Esther, KA4IFF - FISTS # 11 on 30 Meters on the 8th. She was the first FISTS member here in the Colonies. George had visited her and her husband, Elmer just before starting up the International Morse Preservation Society. We generally visit Esther and Elmer every winter when we take our annual trip to Florida. Hope conditions pick up these next two months. Don't get many answers to my CQ's while running QRP - Hi !
