Outside UK: There is an IARU Region 1 (Europe) Band Plan that includes a 60m CW and narrow band segment. Please refer to your national guidelines.

SCORING	There are no scores as such but please send in soapbox logs with total number of QSOs

Activity week "Morse telegraphy - An Intangible Cultural Heritage"

Organizer: AGCW-DL and DARC

This is not a contest but an informal exchange of normal QSOs celebrating Morse code as a treasure of mankind's Intangible Cultural Heritage.

Period: From Sunday to Saturday in the week that contains October 18. This is the International Day of Intangible Cultural Heritage as proclaimed by UNESCO. In 2025 the activity runs from Sunday, Oct 12, 0000 UTC, to Saturday, Oct 18, 2359 UTC.

Frequencies (upper ten kHz of CW bands):

3560 - 3570 kHz

7030 - 7040 kHz

10120 - 10130 kHz

14060 - 14070 kHz

18085 - 18095 kHz

21060 - 21070 kHz

24905 - 24915 kHz

28060 - 28070 kHz

Operating modes: only CW. The same station may be worked once per day and per band.

Participation classes: QRP (up to 5W RF), LP (up to 100W RF)

Log format: ADIF (.adi) The fields qso_date, time_on, band or freq, mode, rst_sent, qth, and name must be included; all other fields are ignored. QSO format is free; name and qth may also be derived from former contacts. Yet, this is NOT a contest; do NOT use contest style.

Log upload: No later than 14 days after the end of the activity to https://contest.agcw.de/ike
